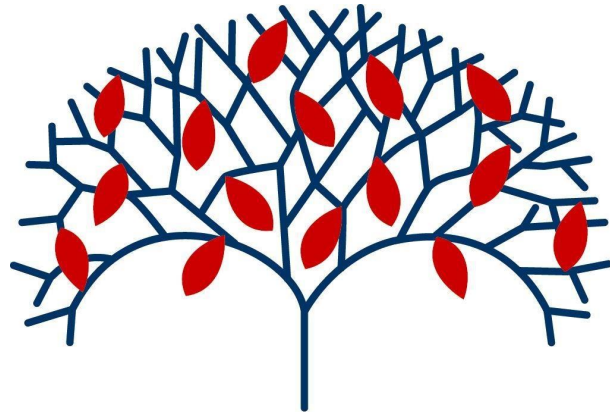

In Year 5, we have had a fantastic half term of learning! The students have loved the DT topic this half term on Global Food. They've got stuck in, literally, forming dough and kneading it, to make our pretzels last week. They also loved making Chinese spring rolls – some students were very keen to make them again at home!

In science, we have actively experimented with forces like gravity, water resistance and air resistance. The students have learnt through doing.

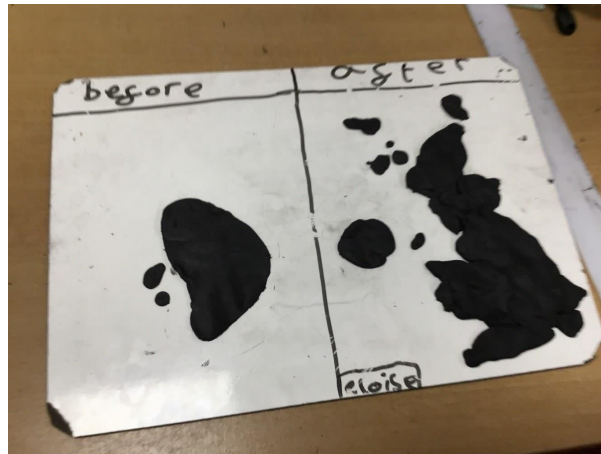

School Meals

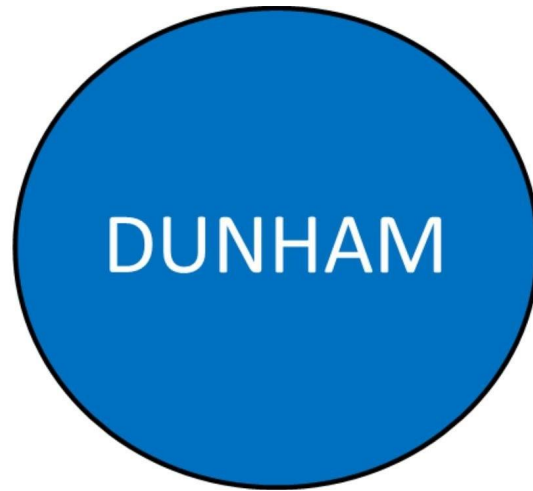

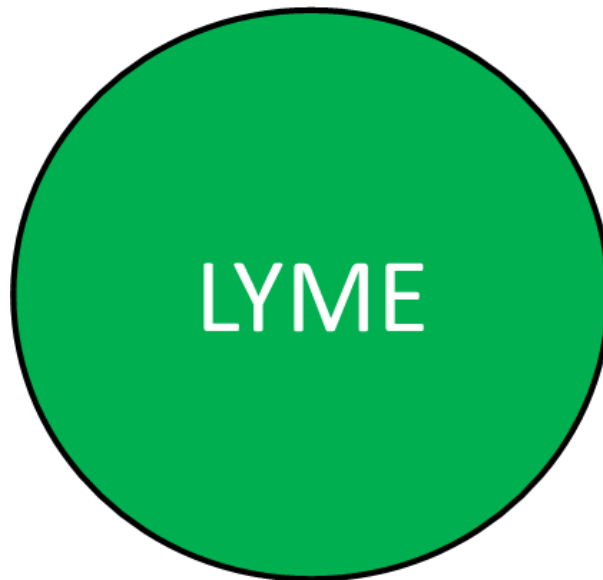




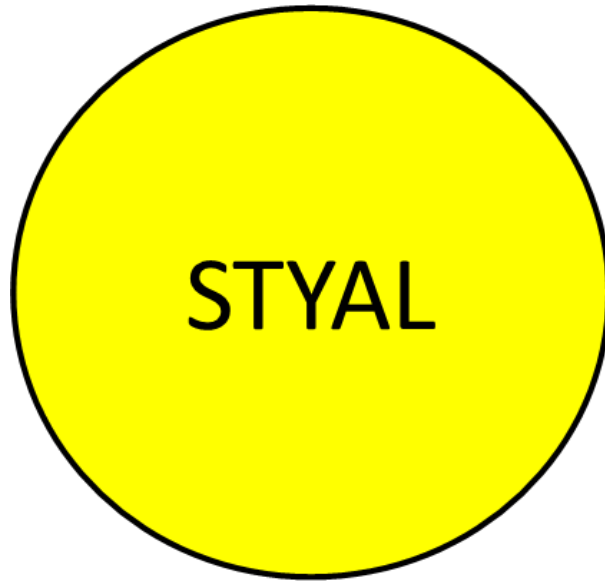
