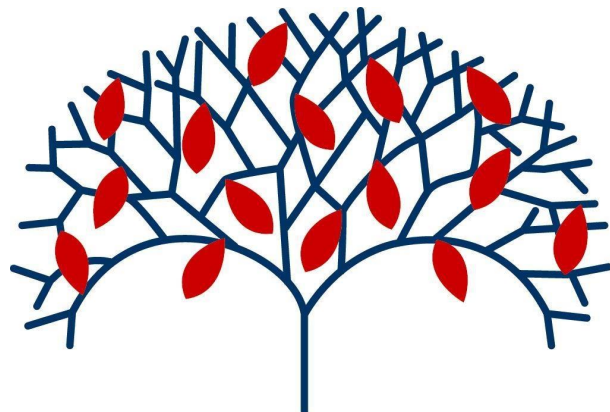

## Remembrance Day

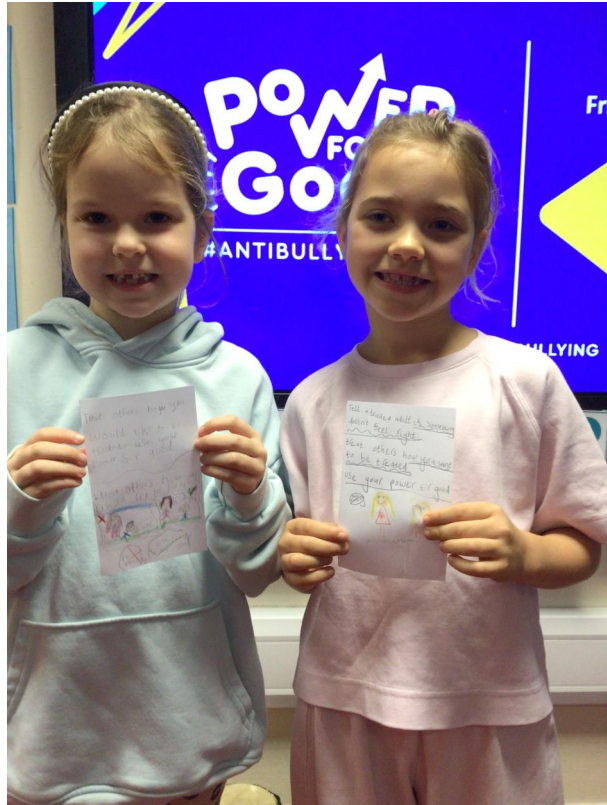

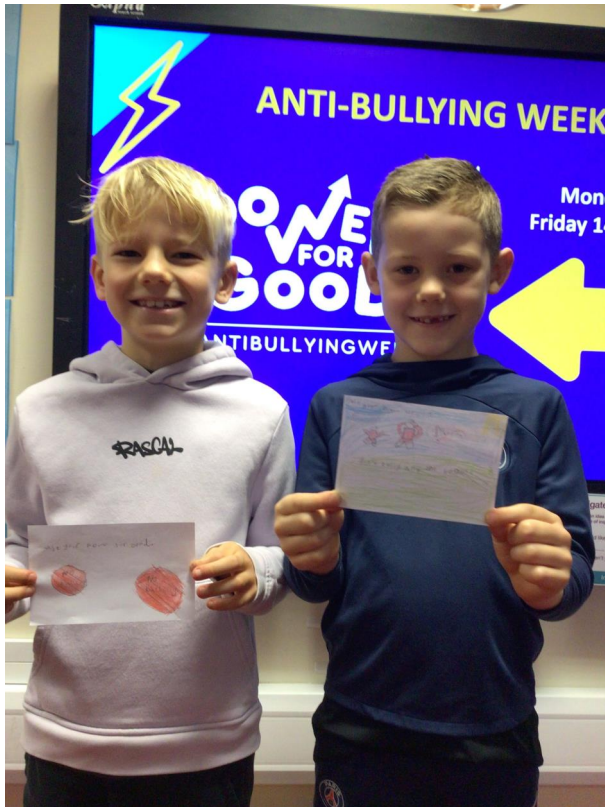


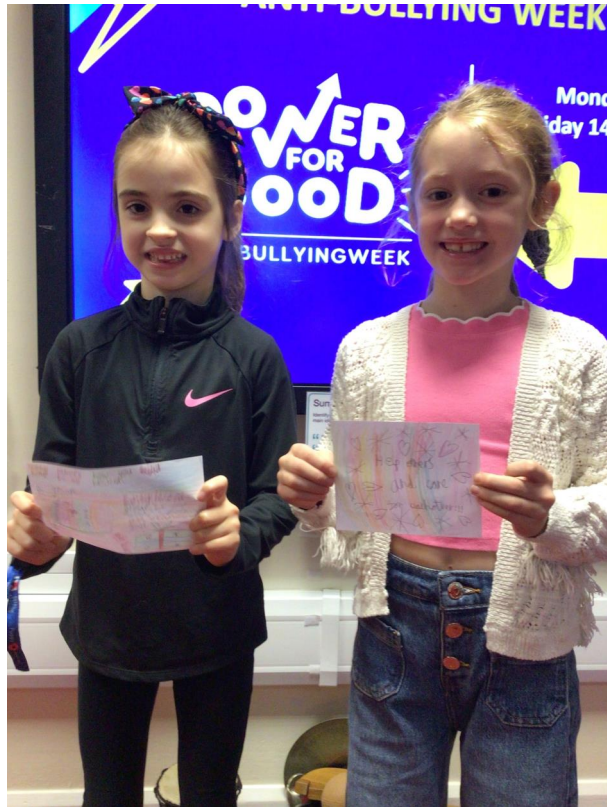


## Anti-Bullying Week

As a school, we have raised £116.77 - thank you!

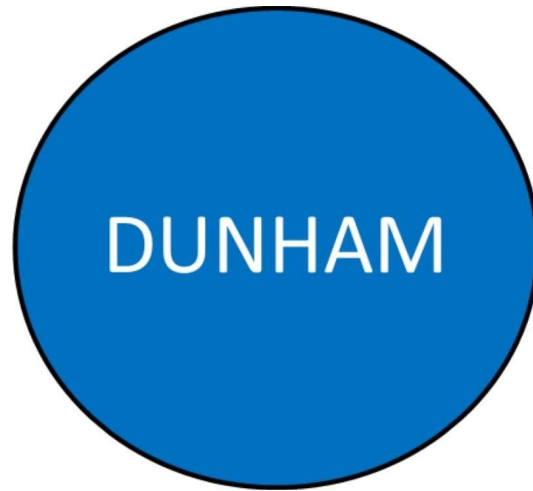
## Year 5/6 Netball

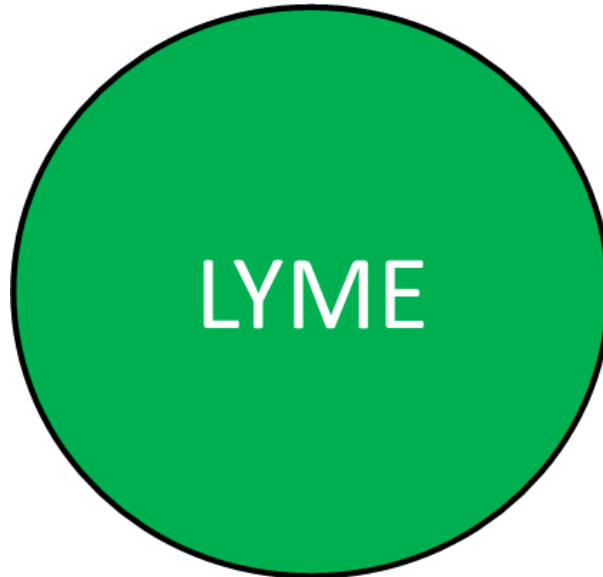

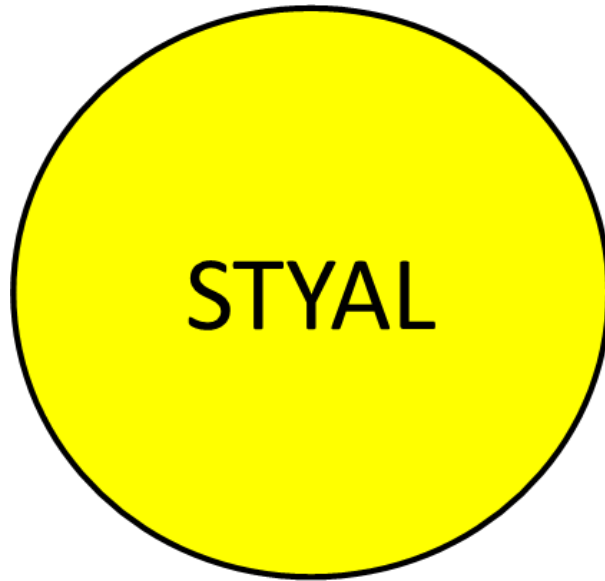
