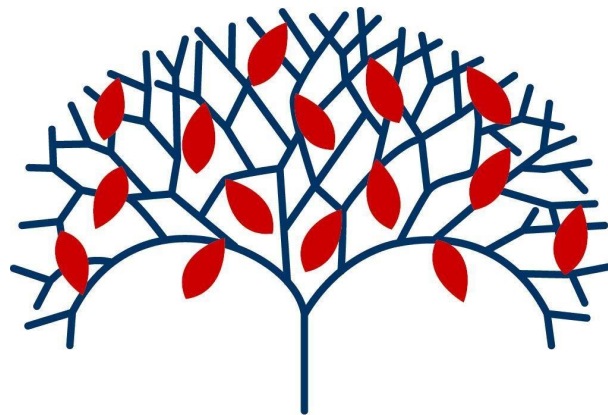

Class Spotlight - Year 6!







Year 6 have thrown themselves into our new topic, *Conflict & Resolution*, with enthusiasm and curiosity. We have been captivated by the characters in our new books, brought vividly to life through descriptions of life during wartime and the vulnerability of young children caught up in conflict. Their experiences have really encouraged us to think deeply about courage, friendship, loss and hope, and we have been inspired to explore these themes in our own writing. In particular, we have loved exploring the story of two best friends living in war-torn France — one Jewish and one not — and considering how their friendship is affected by the events unfolding around them.

Our learning has stretched far beyond English. In History, we have been thinking more deeply about the lives of people in the past as we explore duration and chronology, considering how conflicts throughout history have shaped the world in which we live today. In Art, we have begun studying the work of Henry Moore, exploring his powerful depictions of people sheltering in the London Underground during the Blitz. We have also been busy in Science, where our learning about light has given us another fascinating perspective through which to explore our world.

It has been wonderful to see just how inspired the children have become by this topic. So many pupils have independently extended their learning at home, bringing in additional research projects, beautifully sketched portraits and even wartime recipes! Their enthusiasm and desire to find out more has been fantastic to see and is a real testament to the power of following an exciting topic across the curriculum.

And it hasn't all been indoors! This week we have enjoyed our very first hockey lesson, as well as our first Forest School session, where we have been thinking about being in nature and considering how the natural world makes us feel. We have also had the chance to test out our brand-new orienteering course, combining our outdoor adventure with plenty of mathematical thinking along the way. It has been a wonderfully busy and inspiring start to the term, and we cannot wait to see where our learning takes us next!











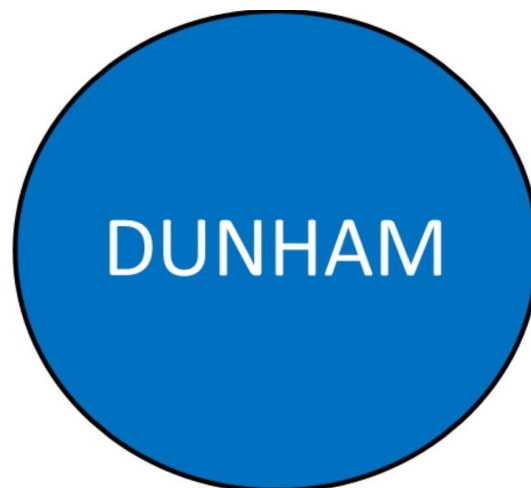
Library Friday

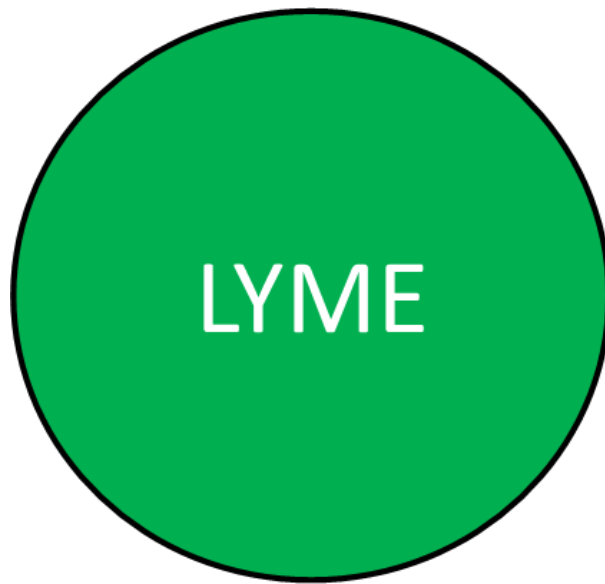
Thank you to all of the Year 6 parents who joined us this morning for our 'Library Friday'! It was great to see our school library so full and alive with reading and sharing stories.

Next Friday, it is Year 5's turn - all welcome.

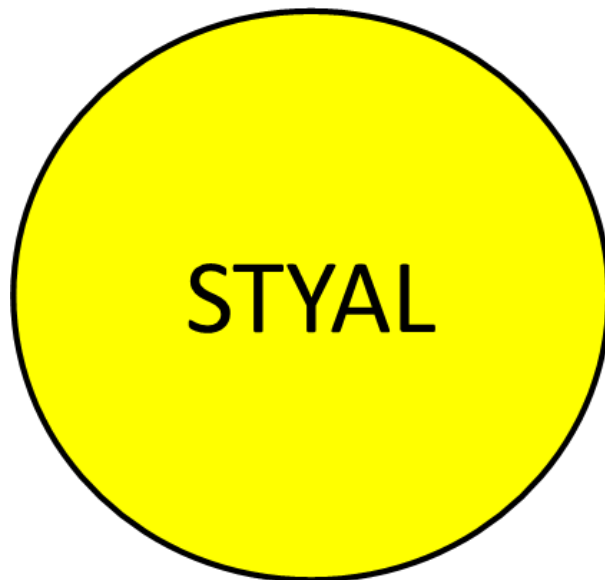
