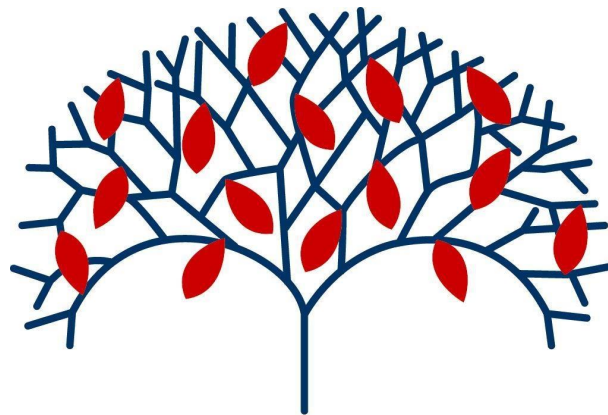

What a busy and exciting week we have had in Year 5!

We have really got stuck into our new books, *Queen of the Falls* and *Rebel Girls*, exploring the incredible story of Annie Edson Taylor and her daring decision to become the first person to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel! We have been developing our reading and comprehension skills while finding out more about this fascinating and fearless woman.

In Geography, we have been exploring what makes different counties special. The children have carried out some fantastic research, discovering interesting facts about different counties and what makes each one unique. This will lead us into exploring Anglo-Saxon and Viking place names, helping us to understand how the history of Britain has influenced the places we live today.

In Science, we have begun our new investigations into forces, exploring how different variables can affect the forces acting on objects. We have been making predictions, asking questions and getting ready to carry out our own investigations.

In Maths, we have been building on our understanding of place value, working with numbers all the way up to 1,000,000 and exploring the value of each digit.

But our learning hasn't stopped in the classroom!

We have been building on our ukulele skills from last year with Ollie, developing our confidence and musical skills. We also took our learning outdoors with our new and exciting orienteering equipment. We had the opportunity to explore the equipment independently before learning more about it and developing our skills at the Orienteering event!

We ended the week with a very special Library Friday, sharing our fantastic new library with our parents and families and enjoying time together reading and celebrating our love of books.

We know that each of them will embrace their roles with enthusiasm, kindness and responsibility, and we look forward to seeing the positive impact they make across our school. Well done to you all!

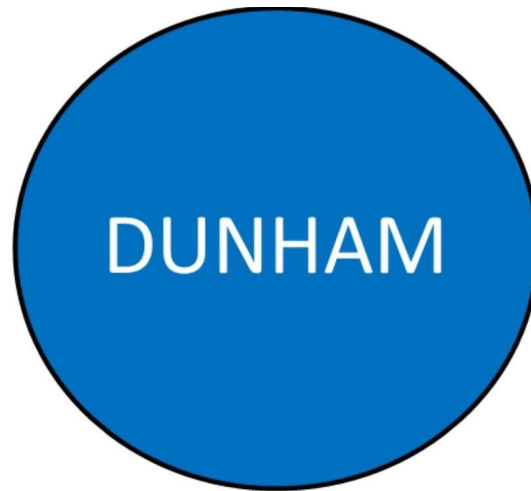
Year 6 Boys' Football Team

What a fantastic start for the Y6 boys football team!

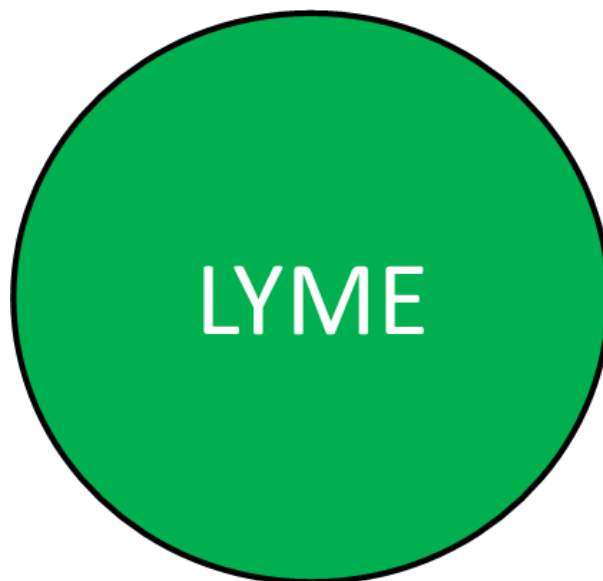

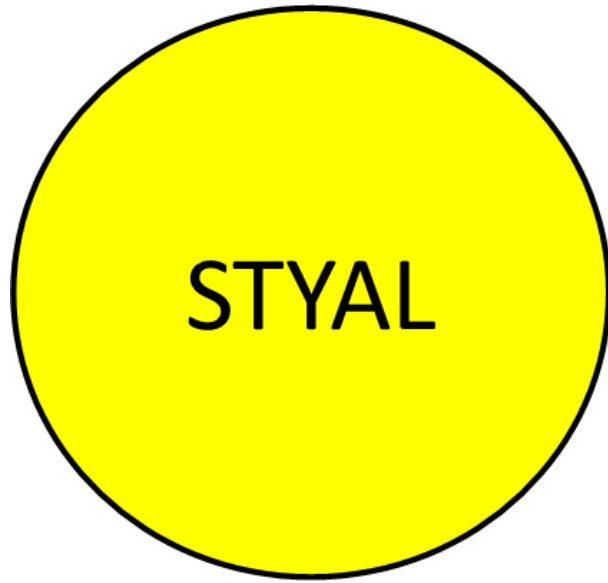
